### *African Wildlife Foundation (TT22 – 4001)*

- \$3 per pay period provides one wildlife scout with their needed patrol gear and equipment (uniform, boots, assorted equipment).

- \$6 per pay period protects an acre at Bracken Cave Preserve for a year. Bracken Cave Preserve is the summer home to about 20 million Mexican free-tailed bats - the largest known colony of bats on the planet.
- \$10 per pay period trains and outfits a bat walk ambassador with an acoustic bat detector and other supplies to conduct educational programming in their communities.
- \$25 per pay period funds a researcher to survey an abandoned mine or cave for a day.

*Friends of the Rouge (TT22 – 4020)*

- \$1 per pay period grows 14 new, joyful Michigan native plants in a Rouge River rain garden for cleaner air and water, less pollution, less local flooding, more critical pollinator habitat, and happy butterflies and songbirds!
- \$2 per pay period brings a student TO the Rouge River for a once-in-a-lifetime experience conducting meaningful STEM science, in waders, at the River.
- \$5 per pay period Brings 3 kids out to the Rouge River for their first-ever kayaking experience with caring Friends of the Rouge guides - to connect with nature and their hometown River! Because to love it, you have to "know" it. And to save it, you have to LOVE it!
- \$10 per pay period brings a team of 5 caring people like you to the River to track frogs, toads, bugs, and fish; clean up trash; open log jams; build a water trail; create a new Rouge River rain garden; and leave a healthier, cleaner and more vibrant River for all!

*Michigan United Conservation Clubs (TT22 – 4030)*

- \$4 per pay period could purchase 100 tree saplings to help our volunteer teams reforest barren areas of public land with quality mast-producing trees to improve food sources and habitat for wildlife.
- \$17.30 per pay period is enough to sponsor a child to spend a week learning about conservation at the Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp.

*National Wildlife Federation (TT22 – 4033)*

- \$1 per pay period funds the planting of a tree by local community groups through the Trees for Wildlife Program.

- \$1 per pay period brings hands-on activities and enhanced learning around important sustainability and nutrition concepts to one kid at an NWF Eco School for one academic year.

*Peregrine Fund, The (TT22 – 4038)*

- \$1 per pay (\$26 a year) impacts the lives of countless individuals around the globe seeking access to safe and reliable transportation. (World Bicycle Relief, 2576)
- \$2 per pay (\$52 a year) supplies an earthquake survivor with critical items including water purification tablets, topical and oral medicines, and antibiotics to fight infections. (Project HOPE, 2537)
- \$5 per pay (\$130 a year) supplies a family with enough clean water for one month. (Oxfam America, 2525)
- \$7 per pay (\$182 a year) supplies one mosquito net for a family. These mosquito nets help protect families against malaria. (Medical Teams International, 2570)
- \$10 per pay (\$260 a year) provides 10 kids with dental services, including exams, cleanings, referrals, procedures and surgeries. (Children International, 2512)
- \$15 per pay (\$390 a year) ensures rapid delivery of life-saving help and supplies, as well as long-term support to help vulnerable families recover. (World Vision, 2534)
- \$20 per pay (\$520 a year) equips 5 students with necessary school supplies (Hope for Haiti, 2583)
- \$25 per pay (\$650 a year) fills a food basket with essentials like rice, oil, beans and wheat. (Save the Children, 2530)

- Provides affordable counseling on a sliding scale.
- Delivers weekend meals to a homebound senior for the entire year.

\$10 per paycheck (\$260 annually)

- Temporary shelter for 1 homeless youth.
- Dental care visit for 1 uninsured individual.
- Friendly visits and assistance to keep 2 seniors in their own homes for the entire year.

\$25 per paycheck (\$650 annually)

- A child is matched with a Big Brother or Big Sister.
- Entire year of social and educational activities for 3 persons with disabilities.
- Tutoring, participation fees, cap & gown, field trips, etc. for 15 local homeless students.

#### **MARQUETTE COUNTY, UNITED WAY OF (TU22)**

- \$10 a month provides a caregiver of a person with Alzheimer's disease or dementia access to education programming and monthly caregiver support groups.
